Leaf: 7in (17.8cm) long; 4.5in (11.4cm) wide; 10 to 11 vein pairs; medium green with .25in (0.6cm) wide, pure white, slightly rippled margins; dull on top; glaucous bloom underneath; ovate with rounded base; flat
